

THE TIGRESS A PAPER TOY SHIP




Materials/Tools

- 1. template printed on card stock* at 100%, borderless, full page (8.5 by 11 inches)
- 2. scissors
- 3. glue stick
- 4. markers, crayons, colored pencils (optional)
- * Cardstock holds up well to lots of play, but regular paper will work too!



Although your computer's print screen may look different than this one, make sure scale is set to 100% and paper size is set to "borderless"

To make the Tigress:

If you are using the blank template, color all the pieces of the ship before cutting the template out.

- 1. Cut out template. Follow the solid black line along the outside of the template. You should have the ship's body, the sail, and the bow (triangle piece).
- 2. Fold the sides of the ship's body. Fold along the white dotted lines.
- 3. Glue the front body tabs to the inside of the sides of the ship forming 2 box corners. Set aside to dry.
- 4. Turn the bow (triangle piece), right side facing down and spread a thin line of glue along the bottom edge of the triangle.
- 5. Glue the bow to the front of the ship. Set aside to dry.
- 6. Fold the edges along the bottom of the sail. Fold along the white dotted lines.
- 7. Roll the sail up gently to create a slight curve of the sail. Unroll.
- 8. Spread glue across the word "glue" on each tab.
- 9. With the front of the sail (image side) facing the bow of the ship, stick the glue covered center tab to center of the deck of the ship. Curve the sail slightly to line sail edge with the edge of the ship's sides. Because you are curving the sail to fit the ship, the glued tabs will overlap some.

By Crom! You made a ship.



Tigress Play Ideas:

Use your breath to blow your ship across the tabletop sea. The ship will sail across any smooth surface. Blow gently into the back of the sail or the bottom of the ship to make it move.


Grab a straw! Blow through a straw to move your ship. The straw helps to form the air into a more direct path. It's fun to steer the ship by moving the straw slightly to the right or left.

Make more than one ship and have a race.

Using blocks or small toys, set up a tabletop or floor obstacle course and practice sailing your ship safely to the other side.


Make an Ocean

1. Print out the wave sheet.




- 2. Cut out the wave pieces. Follow the solid black lines just like you did when you made the Tigress.
- 3. Fold the edges of the rectangle stands. Fold on the dotted lines.
- 4. Glue the edges of the stands to the back of each wave. The stand will curve out from the back of each piece. Set aside to dry.
- 5. Place the waves on your tabletop and blow the Tigress through the sea.






